FINDING FAMILY DOCUMENTS....WHERE TO WRITE

VITAL RECORDS..birth or death, marriage, divorce, how to speed search. No matter what kind of record you are seeking, be sure to state the purpose for which the copy is needed, and your relationship to the person whose record is requested. The file-searching fee----which varies from state to state----should be paid by money order or certified check. The address of the vital-statistics office in each state and the fee charged are listed in an 18-page booklet, "Where to Write for Vital Records", published by the Department of Health and Human Services. For a copy, send \$3.25 to the Consumer Department 216L, Pueblo, Colorado 81009.

VITAL RECORDS UPDATE

INDIANA

Effective 1 January 1984, most Indiana records dated before 1908 will be open for research purposes. Exceptions are adoption records and any other records closed by other statutes. (Tri-State Trader)

ILLINOIS

Birth certificates from Illinois are \$5.00 effective 1 January 1984. It is assumed that other records are the same. (Michigana, Western Michigan Genealogical Society, Grand Rapids, Michigan)

KANSAS

RCGS member Linda WORLEY reports .that birth, death and marriage records ordered from Topeka are now \$6.00 for the first copy and \$3.00 for each additional copy.

HELP IN NEW YORK STATE



LIVING IN COLONIAL AMERICA

To understand how our colonial ancestors managed their daily lives, one should read Colonial Living by Edwin Tunis (Cleveland: The World Publishing Co., 1957). In this book the author presents his material in two ways: a written text and numerous sketches. He has made accurate drawings of colonists homes, their furniture, their equipment, and some of their clothes. He vividly recreates for his readers the households of the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries.

Undoubtedly, the readers will learn many facts they did not know before reading this book. How many readers would know, for example, that colonial housewives. with few cooking utensils and little furniture, had large supplies of linens? Each housewife had this supply to serve family until she organized a gigantic washday every three or four weeks. ther, how many would know that the colonial man wore loose thigh-high leggings called "spatterdashes" to protect his clothing when he rode horseback? Or that women sometimes wore "stirrup stockings" two yards wide at the top, in which they could crowd their petticoats and their modesty while riding astride a horse?

Colonial Living is an easy-to-read, informative, and lively book that should interest any American who is interested in learning more about the past.

"NO ONE ANSWERS MY LETTERS"

Do you write many letters of inquiry but get few replies? Consider then the following article by Evelyn DEXTER ARTHUR in HEAR YE HEAR YE, a publication of the Rochester (New York) Genealogical Society.

When writing requesting help, remember you are asking a favor of someone's time and effort. Letters receoved with paragraph after paragraph filled with details are often tossed aside. Clear, concise, easy to read letters are given preference. One way to insure this is to include a cover letter, containing six brief statements:

- 1. Where the addressee's name was found.
- 2. That you are researching the family name they are connected with.
- 3. Where and with whom in the ancestral line your problem lies.
- 4. Copies of relevant pedigree charts and other pertinent information relating to the family are enclosed.
- 5. That you will be happy to share information in your files and any future findings.
 - 6. Can they help you?

These six statements capsulate what the letter is about and on succeeding pages detail is provided so the reader can quickly understand the data. Information can be put in itemized or statistical form. It is far easier to read a list of data, such as lists of children, vital statistics, place of residents, military service, etc. Use separate lines for each item, rather than using paragraph form, makes for quicker reference.

When placing a query, consider inserting 'postage refunded' in yours. It adds impetus to a person's replying.

Many people will discard a letter if it does not include the SASE. Finally. do not forget to ASK A QUESTION. If there is no question asked, no reply is needed.

It isn't your position, but your disposition that makes you happy or unhappy.

THE ARMCHAIR GENEALOGIST

A friend well versed in the art of genealogy was heard to remark that much can be done by family fact finders working right in their own home. Heedless of my friend's advice and 'mad for travel', this beginner found any excuse good enough reason for setting out to find those roots wherever they might be.

After a few worthless junkets, which left me more frustrated then fulfilled, I harked back to my friend's words and took a more sober approach to searching for those elusive kin. An old letter, dated and written in Strasbourg in 1872, stirred me to write a letter in French (with lots of help from an old college textbook) to the Ville de Strasbourg to find out what I could about my great-great grandfather. A very polite reply, also in French, was received noting that no records existed in that place for the person of the inquiry. but since there was a marriage license for his brother in which a birthplace was given, it might not be a bad idea to try in that town for the desired information.

A subsequent letter to Boersch, Bas au Rhin, France brought forth in reply a birth certificate, not only for great-great grandfather, but also for his father and his father's father.

So, you too might like to be an Armchair Genealogist. It could lengthen your list of progenitors, let you hop the ocean for the price of a foreign stamp and perhaps even improve your skill in a foreign language. N'est pas?

THE LOST STATE OF FRANKLIN

The state named Franklin, once a part of the U.S., no longer exists, and most Americans have never heard of it. But, for four years it was a reality.

In 1784, to satisfy a debt, North Carolina ceded a huge section of its over-Mountain Territory to the U.S. It took 30 days for news of the cession to reach the remote wilderness territory that North Carolina had so high-handedly given away. Unhappy about it, the frontier settlers called a convention in the county seat of Jonesboro and established themselves as a state, named for Ben Franklin.

North Carolina repealed the cession in Nov. 1784, but the Franklanders, as they called themselves, went on with their plans for statehood. The first governor was John Sevier, a dashing frontiersman and Indian fighter. Although Congress would not accept a Franklander representative and North Carolina Gov. Josiah Martin declared the new state in revolt, Sevier set up the state's legal and military machinery in his log cabin capitol building, founded Washington College and made treaties with the Cherokees. The states population was a paltry 25,000. Salaries were usually paid in linen, furs, liquor and tobacco. Since North Carolina had never given up its claim to the region, taxation was double for residents, and the law had to operate through two court systems. Indian troubles, feuding and allegations that Sevier was involved in shady deals in real estate and with the Spanish exacerbated the problems of keeping Franklin afloat. In 1788, Franklin lost its fragile hold on statehood. Today, it is part of Tennessee.
